# ASSESSMENT HUNT: PSYCHOMOTOR



Psychomotor Peer-Assessment allows students to engage with each other while thinking about cues and what the partner is doing well or can do better with. This assessment provides an honest opinion from somebody other than the teacher.

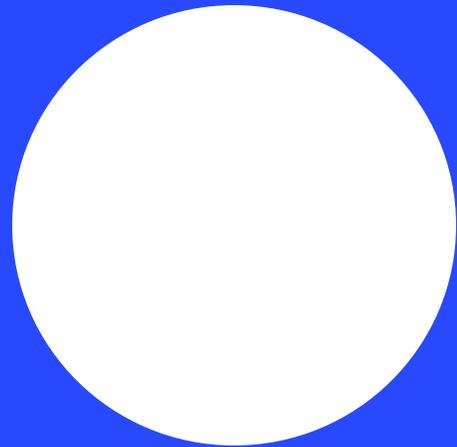

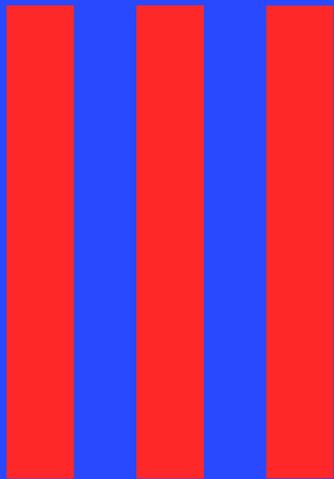

Psychomotor checklist allows the teacher to observe students throughout the lesson and grade them based on observed results.



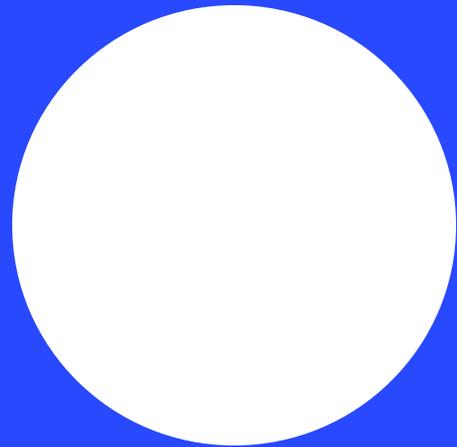

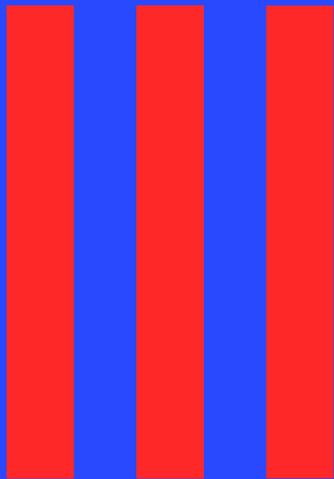

# ASSESSMENT HUNT: PSYCHOMOTOR



Psychomotor Rubric gives students a baseline of expectations for what they need to be able to do throughout the class and what score they would receive accordingly.



### PE Skill Outcome Scoring Rubric

The following PE Skill Outcome Scoring Rubric can be used to convert the results of the PE Skill Assessment Sheets for grading purposes:

**4 Points: A Gold Medal Performance.** The student performed the skill fluently, confidently, and consistently with no mistakes. The student **EXCEEDED** standards. 

 The student completed all of the six required elements

**3 Points: A Silver Medal Performance.** The student performed the skill smoothly and consistently with very few mistakes. The student was able to **MEET** standards. 

 The student completed 4 or 5 of the six required elements

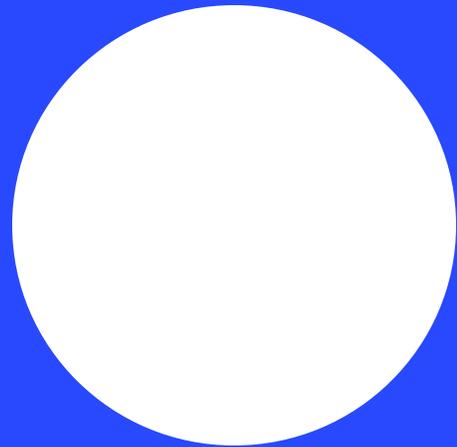
**2 Points: A Bronze Medal Performance.** The student was able to perform the skill but lacked control and consistency in their movement. The student **DID NOT MEET** standards. 

 The student completed 2 or 3 of the six required elements

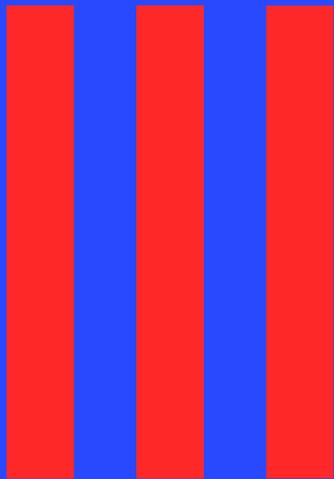
**1 Point: A Participation Ribbon Performance.** The student was not able to perform the skill with any control and consistency. The student **DID NOT MEET** standards. 

 The student completed 1 or less of the six required elements

Cognitive Exit slip allows written proof of student learning at the conclusion of each lesson, teacher can grade them and bring them back for the next lesson.

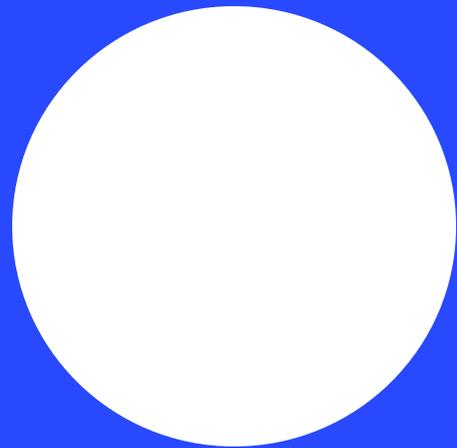

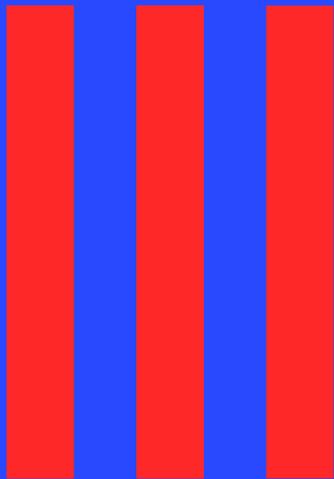

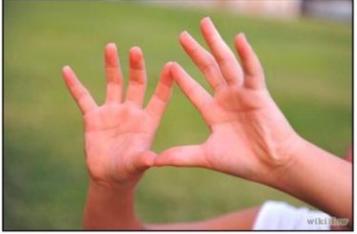


Cognitive Quiz checks for understanding that students are grasping the content as intended.

# IMPLEMENTATION OF ASSESSMENT



Students will be assessed in the psychomotor domain by the teacher moving around station to station or observing a whole class activity watching for specific skills or objectives dependent on the objective. This example is data taken from lesson 2 of the unit based on success rates of catching.

# ANALYSIS OF BEGINNING DATA

This data is taken from lesson two of this unit and shows that majority of the students in the class found themselves not reaching the success rate targeted for the end of this unit. This leaves a lot of room for improvement over the course of the next three lessons in the psychomotor domain. The teacher assessed this data taking time with each student station by station documenting what the student was presenting.

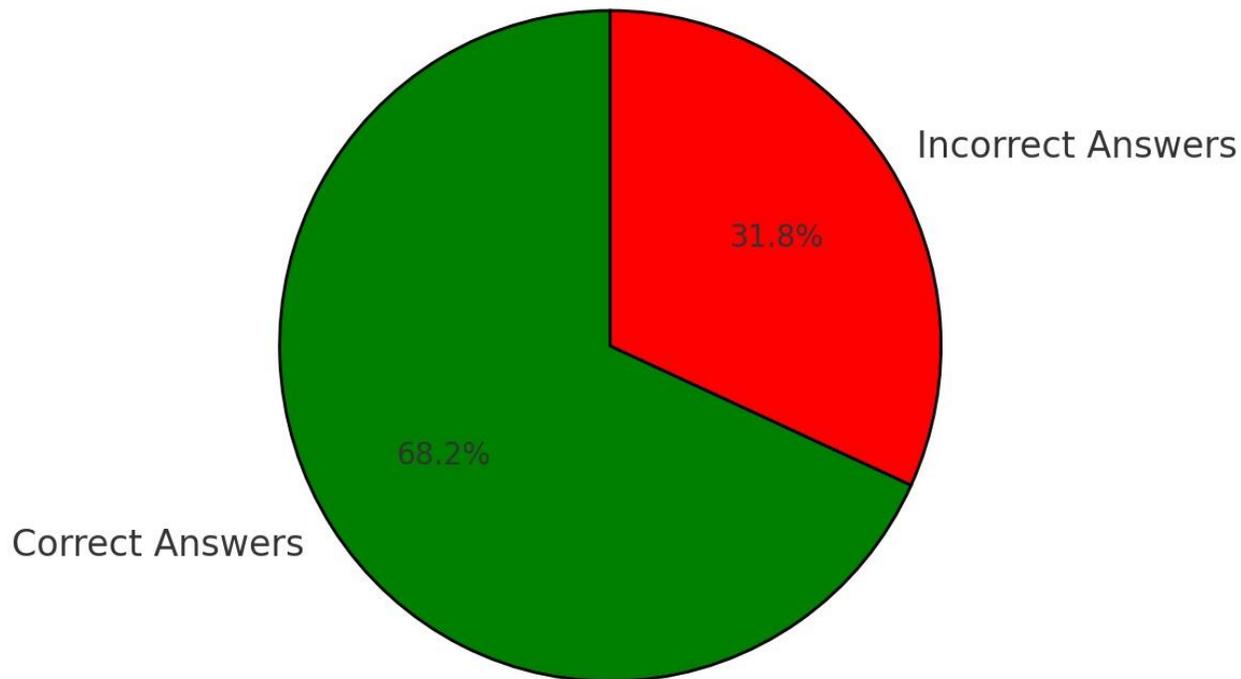

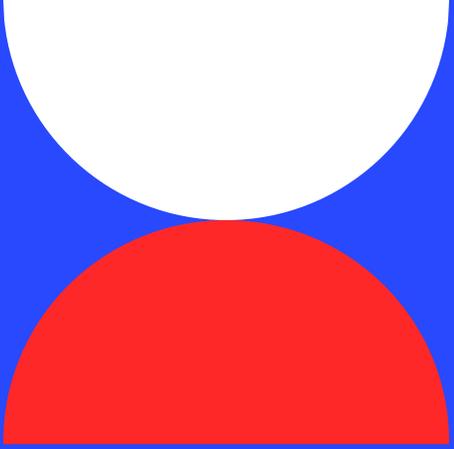

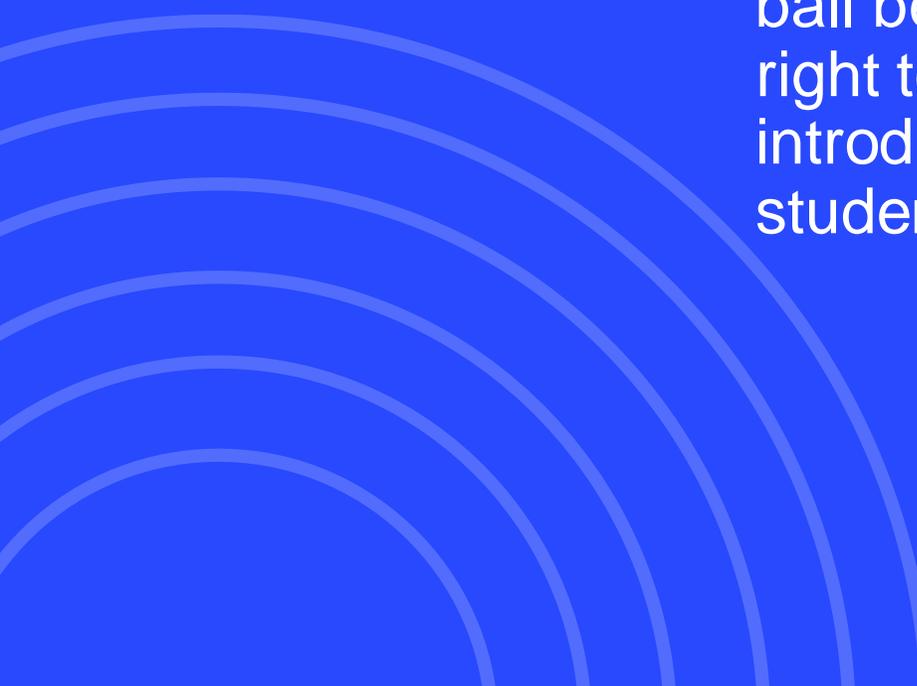
Exit Slip Question Results



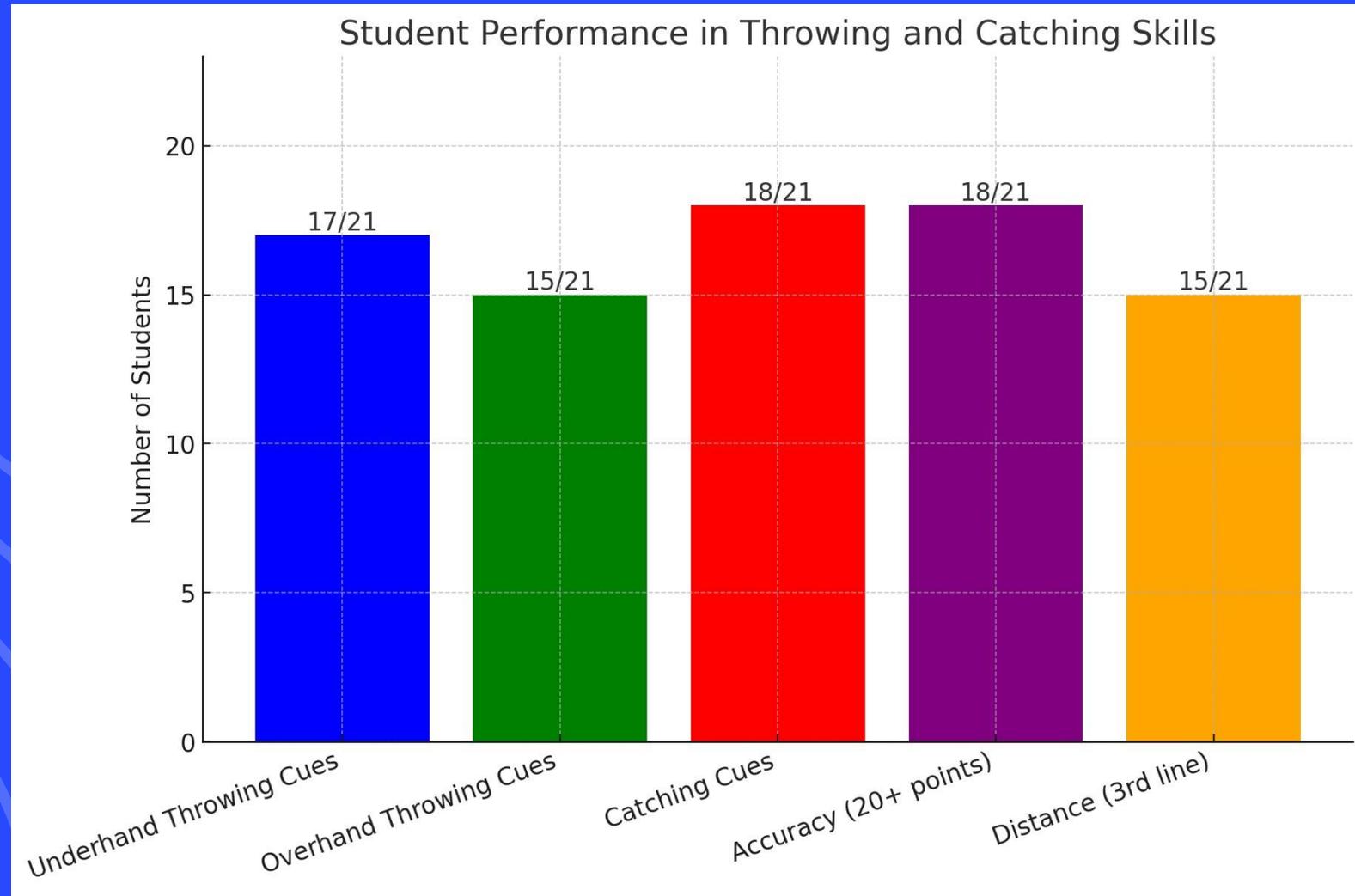


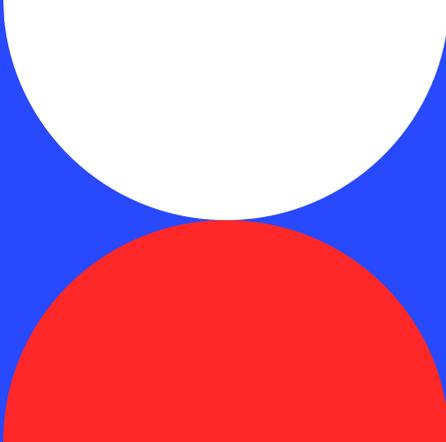
# ANALYSIS OF BEGINNING DATA

Students showed more success cognitively from this lesson and majority of students were able to successfully differentiate how to catch a ball below the waist rather than one coming right towards you. I attribute this success to the introduction of the lesson emphasizing to students to think about different ways to catch.

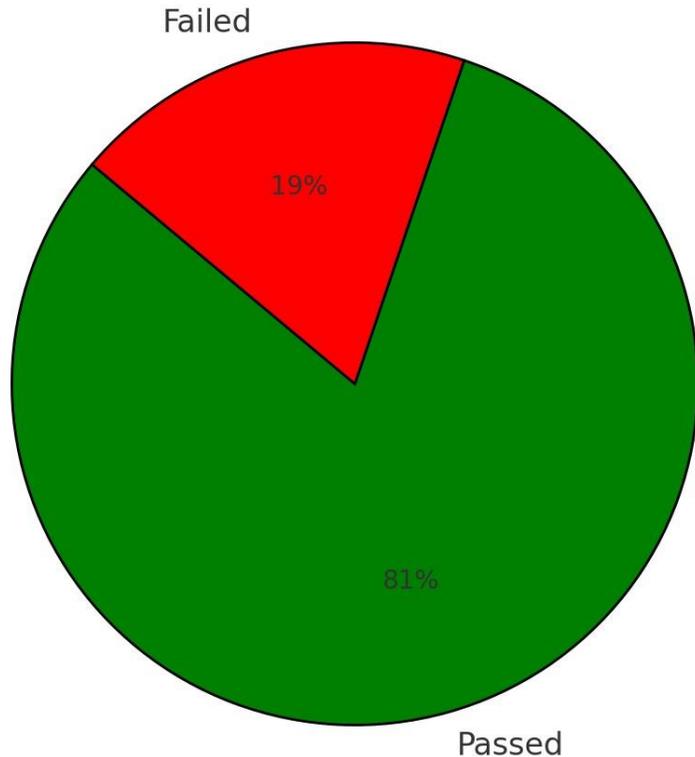
# ANALYSIS OF FINAL DATA

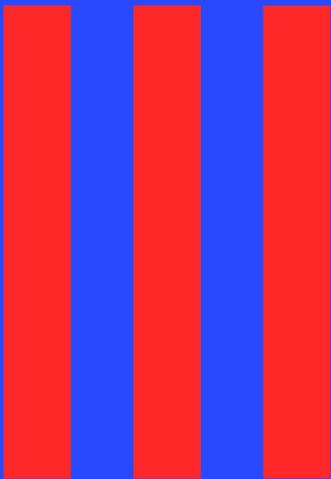
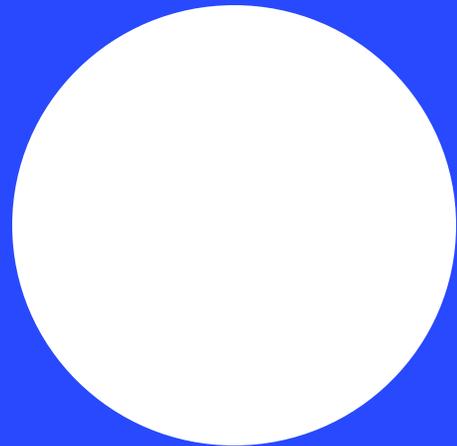
# ANALYSIS OF FINAL DATA

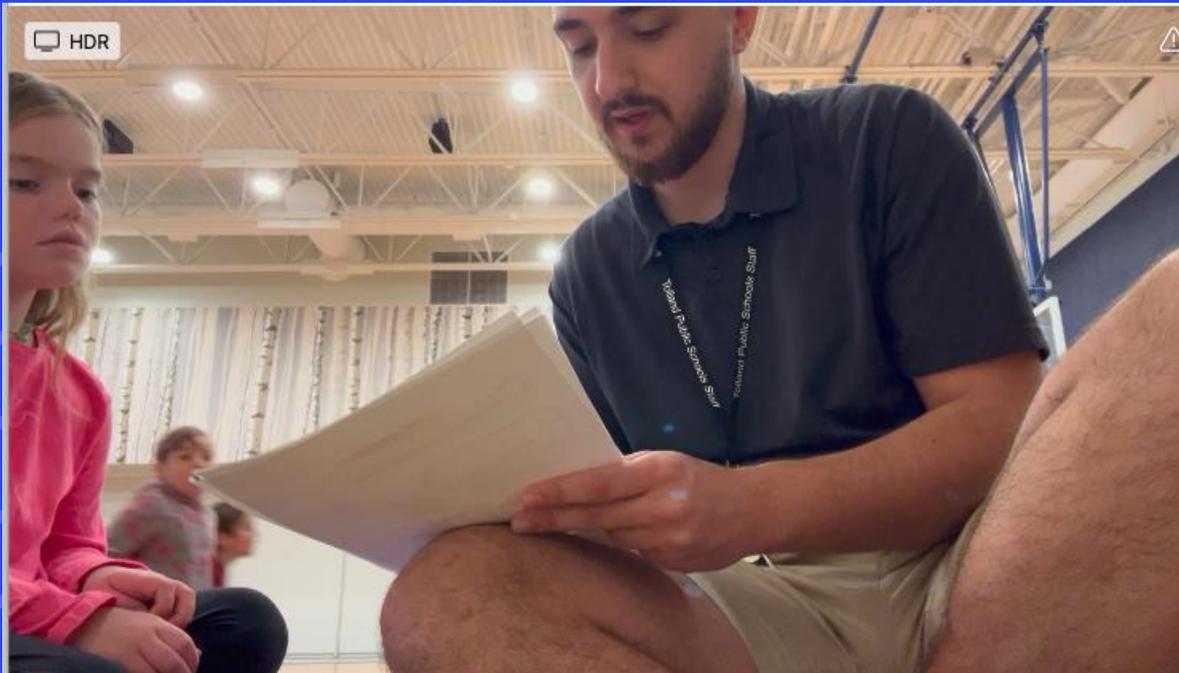

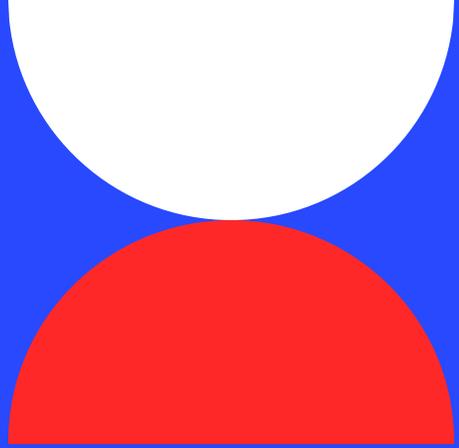

Any concerns of validity should be put at ease due to the number of assessments given out over the course of this unit, and the amount of footage taken of myself giving corrective feedback to students, emphasizing the goals of all lessons, and myself maneuvering throughout the entire gym space during every lesson. Students were always given multiple chances before getting score on the checklist. Cognitively, I have every students exit slip graded and feedback given on the final assessment to focus students.

# REFLECTION FOR FUTURE ASSESSMENTS

This experience with assessment has been incredibly valuable for my growth as a teacher. In talking with my cooperating teacher, I have concluded that for this age group the simpler the better. I have found greater success numbers with circling the best option rather than having the students write answers out. I have also learned how tricky it can be using a checklist in a lesson, and I would strongly consider developing a rubric to go with the checklist to give myself a pre determined scale to work from.

# ASSESSMENT COMMENTARY

In a direct feedback video with my focus students, one focus student displayed a struggle to recite cues and articulate the “L” shape of overhand throw that was talked about at length throughout multiple lessons. I worked with the student to jog their memory, and they eventually did say the correct answer showing me that this student does grasp the content but may have more of a struggle displaying their knowledge.]



# ASSESSMENT COMMENTARY

The focus students that I speak to in this video, I always speak to in order of low-level to medium level to high-level. This video shows my feedback progress from corrective to positive and then challenging the high-level student to think critically about why the way they are throwing is important and how does it bring in more success.]
